ABOUT SIXTY YLS ALUMNI and their guests spent three very full days, from June 30 to July 2, 2010, exploring Geneva and its outskirts with Dean Robert Post '77. The trip included briefings from officials from international organizations including: the Principal Legal Officer of the World Health Organization; the United Nations Deputy High Commissioner for Refugees, Alex Aleinikoff '77; the Director General of the World Trade Organization; the head of the Legal Division of the International Committee of the Red Cross; and the Legal Officer and Communications Officer of the Global Fund to Prevent AIDS, Malaria, and Tuberculosis. U.S. Ambassador Betty King and Melanie Khanna '97, Legal Advisor to the U.S. Mission to the United Nations and Other International Organizations, also spoke to the group, as well as Ed Girardet '91 MSL, who discussed Media21, a Geneva-based initiative launched in 2006 by a team of international journalists to expand and improve media coverage of key global issues. Christian Bovet, Dean of the University of Geneva's Law School, and Professor Andrew Clapham, Director of the Geneva Academy of International Humanitarian Law and Human Rights, also met with the group, telling them about the exciting international law programs run by the Geneva Academy.



Other highlights of the trip included fascinating tours of CERN, the Patek Philippe Museum, Old Town Geneva, and the magnificent Bodmer Foundation and Museum, the last of which was arranged by Marc André Renold '82 LLM and Foundation Vice-President André Tombet '54 LLM. There were many delicious meals in lovely settings, as well as wine provided by Bruce Littman '70, from his nearby vineyard. Rory MacMillan '94 LLM provided much patient advice as the trip was being planned. The Geneva trip provided a wonderful opportunity for a broad range of alumni to meet each other.
